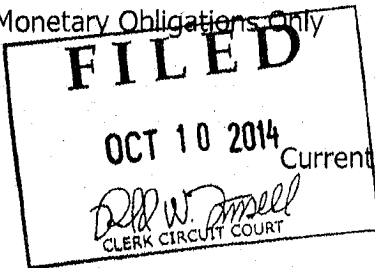

- (1) **HOW VIOLATION OCCURRED:** Violation of condition (5) of the Order of Probation which states, "You will live without violating the law. A conviction in a court of law shall not be necessary for such a violation to constitute a violation of your probation, community control or any other form of court ordered supervision.", in that on 10/04/14, the offender allegedly committed the offenses of Grand Theft-Retail-\$300-\$4900 ,Resisting – Opposing Retail Merchant and Battery-Cause Bodily Harm-Minor Injury-Personal or Special Weapon as evidenced by her arrest in Duval County, FL by the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office.

Circumstances: On 01/21/14, a Jacksonville Sheriff's Officer was dispatched to 10490 San Jose Blvd. to the Target store. Upon the officer's arrival he spoke to loss prevention officers _____ and _____ who had attempted to detain the suspect from leaving the store with a full shopping cart of merchandise. The female suspect had passed all points of sale and was attempting to leave the store. As the two loss prevention officers attempted to handcuff the suspect she resisted by tensing up and pulling away, at some point the suspect kicked loss prevention officer _____ on the leg and was able to leave the store. _____ was able to copy the license plate of the vehicle the suspect drove away in which was a dark colored Dodge SUV type vehicle. The tag number he provided was Florida tag _____ and was registered to a black Dodge utility vehicle owned by _____ at _____. A photo spread was shown to both loss prevention officers and both were able to positively identify _____ as the suspect. The merchandise was recovered and signed for at the store, _____ has a swollen right ankle as a result of the kick.

- (2) **OFFENDER'S STATEMENT:** The offender stated on 10/07/14 that, _____ I have an attorney _____ that has advised me to turn myself in which I have already. This was not me and the tapes that the State Attorney have will prove it. My car was seen driving off the scene and they wrote my tag # down. It was not me that they saw this will be a very easy case once they pull the video."




- 4) **RECOMMENDATION:** This officer is requesting a warrant for the offender even though she is presently on bond for alleged new charges. The offender has a prior record with offenses that appears she may be a danger to the community. The offender has failed to take advantage of Community Supervision to remain at liberty. Her action in the alleged arrest affidavit, if proved correct displays that she may need a more restrictive form of supervision to deal with the requirements on Community Supervision. It is this officer's recommendation if she is found guilty of the new law violation that her probation is modified and extended to include one (1) year of community control, fifty (50) hours of community service with all other conditions to remain the same. If the offender is exonerated of the new law offense this officer recommends that her supervision in this case be terminated.
